Benefits

- Working on the front line of intervention and prevention
- Direct impact, tangible results
- Keeping the community safe

Limitations

- Working on the front line of intervention and prevention
- Grant funding
 - Impacts scope, extent and focus
- Sometimes collecting useful information or data is not trauma-informed



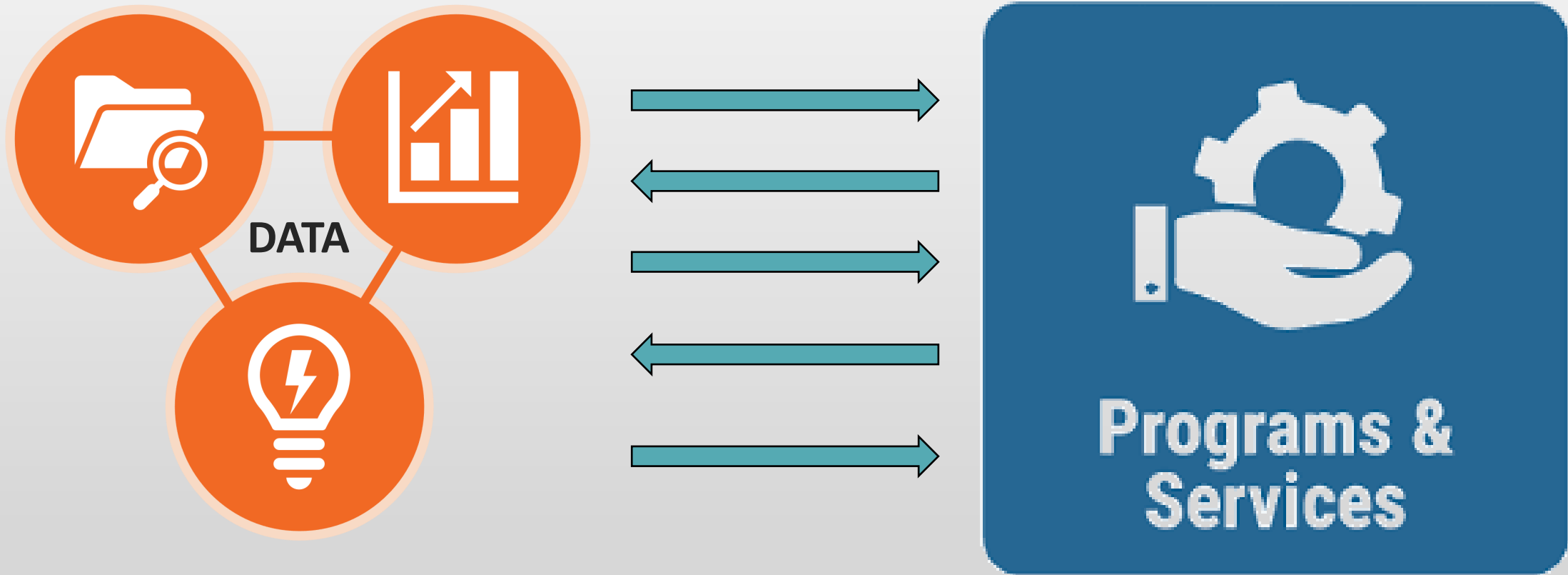
Benefits

- “Just the facts”
 - Unemotional, apolitical
- Trend analysis over time
- Locate geographical hotspots
- Identify over-or-under-representation
- Some predictive capability

Limitations

- “Just the facts”
 - Unemotional, apolitical
- How is the data presented?
- Data experts are not on the front line of programming/intervention

DATA to ACTION

- Partnership with the Maryland Department of Health
- Initial conversations during the Summer 2023
- Develop ongoing Data to Action webinar series
 - Injury/violence prevention topics
 - One data expert, one program expert
- Goals:
 - Educate injury and violence prevention professionals on the relationship between data and programming
 - Create partnerships and foster synergy between data-focused groups and program/service-focused groups

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DATA to ACTION – Series Highlights

- Data to Action: Intimate Partner Violence Homicide on December 7th, 2024 – **104 Attendees**
- Data to Action: Suicide on January 11th, 2024 – **70 Attendees**
- Data to Action: Violent Deaths on February 29th, 2024 – **118 attendees**
- Data to Action: ACE's on April 29th, 2024 – **104 attendees**
